#### A Note from Your President

Now finishing my second season as your President I have to say I'm starting to feel like my roots are planted. It definitely takes time to learn the finances, policies and procedures, goals, objectives, the different leagues and groups within the club, what's important and what to ignore. As another season comes to a close there is much to be proud of when it comes to your Kelowna



curling club. Your board of directors have been hard at work putting in countless hours to make this a better place.

I've learned in my career that it is always best to start with identifying goals. Think about shooting an arrow at a target. The center gives you a clear goal to hit. By having a specific target, it is easy to see which arrows were most successful. You will also be able to discern what needs to be done to improve your aim. Some of the goals the board have heard from members is to replace the furniture, improve the ice conditions, do some painting, replace the scoreboards, to name a few. The decision on where to start is a daunting one. We must prioritize what is the most important given our financial position, and figure out what other minor or even major expenses are looming. The board went on to review and build out the strategic plan. What your board determined was that we needed an expert opinion of the building. Assuming the building was in good shape wasn't good enough. Why would we spend good money if the building wasn't in good shape?

Your board decided to reach out to the City to have a formal discussion about the building...their building. Jointly with the City of Kelowna we hired Read Jones Christoffersen Ltd (RJC), an engineering firm, to complete a Building Condition Assessment Report. . It was important to know exactly how our building was doing from a structural standpoint. Upon completion of the report, Jock Tyre, Andrew Adamson (Treasurer), Peter Ellison (Past President) and I met with a representative of the City and a manager of RJC to review the report. There was much learned. Our building is 38 years old. Similar aged buildings in Kelowna have been replaced – recently The Yacht Club (40 years old). The footings of our building are solid. The engineer figures the building is good for another 25 years or more. The areas of concern in the next 5 years deal with replacing the mechanical equipment (\$800,000), the roof (\$1,000,000) and the floor (\$2,900,000). The floor has a heating system under it to keep frost down. Part of the Penticton curling club's heating under the floor stopped working for them and the floor started to heave – this isn't good for high quality ice! So far our floor has made it 38 years without a major problem but we are running on borrowed time. Overall, RJC determined that an injection of \$6.6 million dollars was necessary to get the club back to a point where another 25 years is attainable (other than mechanical where it can be as little as 15 years).

So where do we go from here? Your board is preparing a letter to be submitted to the City with the various options available to us. Is the decision to fix this building? Should another curling rink be built? Or should the City build a multi-purpose facility with skating rinks that could share the mechanicals to a degree? Once the outcome is determined we'll be sure to keep you informed.

#### Some closing remarks:

- The club is doing well from a financial perspective. Loans were made to us by the City years ago and by next year we will have them repaid;
- Membership is strong and continues to increase;
- We are figuring out the best course of action in replacing the furniture upstairs;



- The inauguration of The World's Largest Beer Spiel is coming to the Kelowna curling club in 2018 (stay tuned); and
- We are here for you.
